Dear Parents,

As we get closer to the end of the year, the students will be reviewing key math concepts. These are topics that have already been taught. I strongly encourage you to have your child keep practicing the multiplication facts. Currently, we are exploring long division. Most students understand the steps and the concepts but are having difficulty because their math facts are not memorized.

Looking ahead to 4th grade math, knowing these facts will help the students with long division, fractions, simplify fractions, and converting decimals.

It is also a good idea to encourage your child to read books other than “silly” books. For example, I am seeing a lot of Captain Underpants, Pokemon, and SpongeBob books. While I agree if you have a child who does not like to read, get them to read what they enjoy. They are at the age where the books should be more age appropriate.
