Dear Parents,

Welcome to a new school year! I love the first day of school when we welcome both new and returning students and parents. Everyone arrives optimistic about the promising year ahead.

We began our new year today with Mass where we prayed for a successful school year for all. Many thanks to Mrs. Zappelli and Mrs. Yee for preparing our opening liturgy and to our celebrants, Father Rossi and Father Wade.

Thanks to many people, our school year is off to a smooth beginning. The faculty have carefully prepared their classrooms to welcome your children. Debra Rossi, Tisha Costantini and the PTG Board hosted a lovely dinner earlier this week to welcome Kindergarten and new parents, and Michelle Bilafer, Cortney Hyland and Mimi Koberlain prepared this morning's Welcome Coffee. Julie Pierce prepared the wonderful resource guide for new families so they will be informed about our St. Pius Community. Kathy Wright and Mary Salom reviewed all immunization records to ensure that all students are in compliance with state law regarding immunizations. Alicia Gray ordered and, with the help of parent volunteers, sold sweatshirts and PE shorts and Kristin Bright helped many families with the Uniform Exchange. The library is cleaned and decorated and ready for the students thanks to Candace. I am very grateful to all these people who worked so hard to be sure this year began on a positive note.

It was quite exciting this summer to watch the day-to-day renovation of the asphalt on the entire plant. I know the students will get tremendous pleasure from the newly resurfaced and re-stripped playground.

I also enjoyed watching the transformation of Homer Crouse Hall. What a difference a coat of paint makes! Thanks to the PTG and Women's Club Auction Fund-a-Need, Homer Crouse has been painted, has new ceiling fans and is waiting for newly ordered windows to be installed.

This summer we purchased 55 new laptops for students to use in the lab and with the mobile laptop carts. This is also a result of PTG auction profits and student Shamrock-a-Thon fundraising. I hope you all agree that we have spent your donations wisely.

In your brown envelopes are many items that need your attention. I'm sure returning families are glad they signed the many forms last May! The Parent-Student Handbook can be found on the school website. There is a form for you to sign and return indicating that you have reviewed the Parent-Student Handbook with your child(ren). These forms should be returned by **Monday, August 29**.

If you have not yet done so, please go online and complete the Background Check Authorization Form for persons volunteering to work with children and youth. If you have already done this (either with a paper copy or online), you do not have to re-submit another. Shield the Vulnerable, an online safety program, must also be completed by anyone who wants to volunteer at school, in any capacity, with children. The website for both of these is www.shieldthevulnerable.org.

Again, this year, state law requires that I give you written notification about the existence of asbestos in our school. Please read the enclosed letter in your brown envelope. Finally, for our new parents only, if you have not already done so, please complete and return the Archdiocesan survey. Your attention to these forms is very important, and I do appreciate the time it will take for you to complete all this paperwork.

There are very few changes to this year's Parent-Student Handbook. These include deleting the "missing work" policy established last year for grades 6, 7 and 8 and deleting the "no playing" before school begins. Faculty review of these items determined they were not accomplishing the desired results. Other minimal changes clarified existing policies. I would encourage you to pay particular attention to details in the uniform section. This year we will be using the report card that we piloted last year. Teachers will address this at Back to School Nights.

Please remember to use the physician's statement form (found in the handbook and included in this newsletter) if any medications must be taken while your child is at school. This must be signed by both a parent and a doctor and pertains to all medication including Tylenol, aspirin, cough syrup, etc. (both prescription and over-the-counter medication).

Back-to-School Nights will be held next Tuesday, August 30, for grades 6-8 and Wednesday August 31, for grades 1-5. Both evenings, **for parents only**, will begin at 7:00 PM in Fitzsimon Center. The teachers in grades 6-8 will all present together in Fitzsimon Center. Teachers in grades 1-5, after the general session, will give two presentations in their respective classrooms at 7:25 PM and 7:50 PM. These are always informative evenings and a great opportunity to meet your child's teachers. I want to remind you that this is not an evening for conferences. Should you want a meeting with a teacher, feel free to schedule an appointment. Again, thanks to the PTG Board members, refreshments will be provided.

There are many after school classes and activities being offered this year. Information on Spanish, French, golf, jewelry making, soccer, basketball, chess, manners and tennis are attached to this newsletter.

This year we will continue to offer pizza lunch on Tuesdays and the PTG sponsored hot lunch on Thursdays. Information on the Thursday hot lunches will be sent home. Choicelunch will provide lunches on long Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays beginning August 29. No lunches are served on minimum days. Pizza lunch will begin Tuesday, August 30. Please see the end of the newsletter for more information.

Dismissal for all grades tomorrow and Friday, August 25 and 26, will be at 12:45 PM. Starting Monday, August 29, Kindergarten will be dismissed at 2:30 PM and the dismissal for grades 1-8 will be at 3:00 PM.

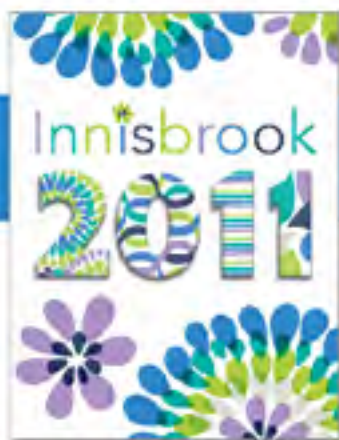

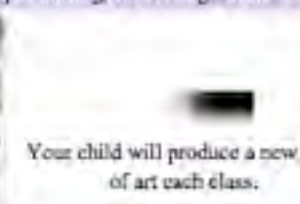
